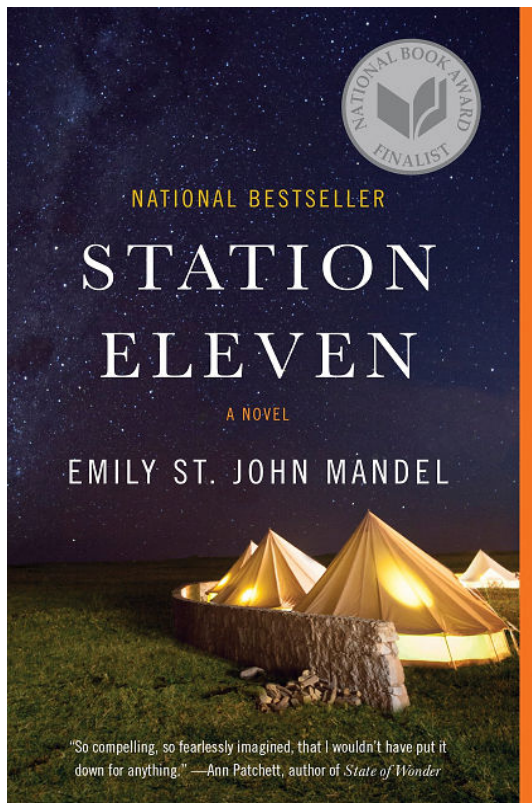


# Station Eleven
